



Culture Camp 2014

August 11th to 15th, 2014 at Helen's Fish Camp

It's that time of year again, the Lands, Resources and Heritage department will be hosting a free Culture Camp for ages 8-15. As in the past, a wide range of cultural and educational activities will be available to participants.

All participants will be given a morning/afternoon snack and lunch. A schedule will be provided to parents/guardians in the morning on the first day of camp.

Activities and Educational Components

Medicine making, gopher snaring and cleaning, canoeing, fishing, setting nets, drum making, dream catcher making, Southern Tutchone language lessons, tree identification, archery, soapberry ice cream making, Wildland Fire education, Bear Aware education, outdoor survival skills, introduction to GPS and mapping, and more!

Daily Itinerary

- Participants are to arrive at the TKC office between 8:30am and 8:45am.
- Transportation is provided from the TKC Office to Helen's Fish Camp at 9:00am.
- Culture Camp begins at 9:30am, and a snack will be provided soon after arrival.
- Lunch is served daily at 12:30pm.
- Snack is provided mid-afternoon.
- All participants are required to assist with camp clean-up prior to departure.
- Departure is at 4:00pm, with participants returning to the TKC office by 4:30pm.
- Parents/Guardians are responsible for pick-up at 4:30pm.

There will be a designated First Aid person at the camp daily.
Should an injury occur, the Participant shall go to them immediately for treatment.

Expected Conduct of Participants

Culture Camp is always an exciting week. While there is a daily itinerary and pre-planned events, the participants also have free time. At the beginning of each day, Camp staff will go over the itinerary, as well as appropriate behaviour while attending camp. Should disciplinary action need to be taken, the participants will determine, as a group, how they will be disciplined.

Expected Behaviour by Participants:

- ✓ Respectful attitude towards all participants, Elders, Citizens, group leaders and staff
- ✓ Must stay with their group and follow the schedule
- ✓ Clean up after themselves

Behaviour that is not permitted by Participants:

- × Use of foul and derogatory language including inappropriate gestures
- × Horse play and violence
- × Littering
- × Straying from group or joining a group that the participant was not assigned to
- × Disrespecting participants, Elders, Citizens, group leaders and staff
- × Entering the kitchen area unless requested by a cook or cook helper
- × Tampering with equipment
