Verna J. Kirkness Education Foundation Program

The VJKF Program offers Indigenous (First Nation, Métis, and Inuit) high school students an opportunity to spend one week conducting research in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and math during the month of May. As one of our Kirkness scholars, you'll work with university professors and graduate students from one of our partner universities researching a specific topic of interests. All our students are given an opportunity to let us know which areas of STEM research that most interests them.

VJKF Program Details

- All expenses are paid if a student is accepted into the VJKF Program.
- As part of our application process students will select which research areas they are most
 interested in. We will send accepted students a list of research opportunities that will note which
 university is sponsoring the program, and what week that specific program will run. Students will
 be able to select their top 5 choices that interest them most. We will do our best to match students
 with their #1 choice, but can't guarantee that will be possible in all cases.
- Sample Program week can be found on our website. Student can only participate in ONE week.
- Accepted students will be emailed a copy of research opportunities and the dates for those specific programs when available. Do not wait to apply as we are accepting applications on a first-come basis. We strongly recommend applying early, as this year's program is capped at 100 students, and we will likely have a waiting list.
- On the final afternoon of the Program, your group will make a presentation about your learnings from the lab for the week. Don't worry there's lots of group time to build a successful presentation.
- All students participate in our certification celebration on Thursday night.



PART 7—PARENTAL CONSENT

I understand that has applied to participate in the Verna J. Kirkness Education Foundation Program (hereinafter called the "Program") that includes lectures with professors from participating Program universities.

I understand that participation in the Program will involve:

- 1) the applicant spending one week on a university campus and working as part of a research team from a university;
- 2) as part of the participation in the Program, the applicant working with a research team will be provided with materials and basic safety training as arranged by the Program;
- 3) during their involvement the applicant may be mentored and supervised primarily by a graduate student;
- 4) there are learning activities in the evenings that will require student attendance.

I understand that there are certain expectations regarding the applicant's conduct during their involvement in the Program, which will be explained to the applicant.

These expectations include:

- The applicant following the instructions given to them by the mentor or lab supervisor.
- The applicant following ALL safety protocols in place during the Program.
- The applicant conducting themselves in a respectful and mature manner at all times.
- The consumption of alcohol or illegal substances throughout their participation in the Program is strictly prohibited.
- Violation of any of the above rules may result in the applicant being asked to leave the Program.

I understand that participation in the Program may involve the applicant coming into close proximity with, and working with scientific apparatuses and/or materials that may be dangerous if mishandled. I understand that all participants will be asked to complete a survey at the end of the Program. I further understand that, if the applicant is accepted to participate in the Program, I will be required to sign a situation specific consent form prior to their participation fully indemnifying the host university, as well as the Program planners, administrators and personnel from any and all liability for any injury which may be suffered by the applicant during their participation. Having read the above, I consent to the applicant's submission of an application to participate in the Verna J. Kirkness Education Foundation Program.
