INFORMATION ON CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSALS

Under section 16.3 of the Constitution, any Citizen who is at least 16 years old can propose a constitutional amendment proposal for consideration by the General Assembly.

In general, section 16.1 of the Constitution requires written notice to Council of any constitutional amendment proposal. That notice has to be provided at least 24 days before a General Assembly. During a General Assembly, at least 60 Citizens must be present to approve a proposed amendment, and approval requires a three-quarter majority vote.
